PSs and USs complete awareness on 2nd 2014 Draft Federal Constitution

Permanent Secretaries, Under Secretaries and senior officials of the various Government Ministries have concluded the Constitutional Reform Unit's (CRU) Public Awareness on the 2nd 2014 Draft Federal Constitution of Solomon Islands today at Heritage Park Hotel.

The Awareness program started on Monday 29th February and was expected to end on Friday 4th March, however; there was a shift in schedule for that week due to the State Funeral of Late Sir Peter Kenilorea and another weeklong PSs workshop the following week.

An extra four days was set aside this week to cover Chapters 8 to 18 and relating schedules.

CRU's Consultant Lawyer Mr. Reginald Teutao made technical and legal explanations on the contents of the 2nd 2014 Draft.

In his concluding remarks, Mr. Teutao thanked these senior and chief government officials for their presence and their contributions, which is highly appreciated and noteworthy.
